Jesus and the Sacraments - What is a Sacrament

- What is a Sacrament?
 - Outward signs of inward grace, instituted by Christ for our sanctification.
 - Sacraments have a visible and invisible reality.
 - The visible reality we see in the Sacraments is their outward expression, the form they take, and the way in which they are administered and received.
 - The invisible reality we cannot "see" is God's grace, his gracious initiative in redeeming us through the death and Resurrection of his Son.
 - His initiative is called *grace* because it is the free and loving gift by which he offers people a share in his life and shows us his favor and will for our salvation.

Jesus and the Sacraments – What we celebrate

- How many sacraments does the Church recognize?
 - Guided by the Holy Spirit, the Church recognizes the existence of seven sacraments instituted by Jesus. Can we name the sacraments?
 - The Sacraments of Initiation:
 - Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.
 - The Sacraments of Healing:
 - Penance (or Reconciliation or Confession) and Anointing of the Sick.
 - The Sacraments of Service:
 - Marriage and Holy Orders.
 - Through the Sacraments, God shares his holiness with us so that we, in turn, can make the world holier.

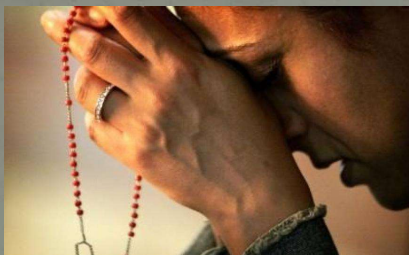
