Spiritual Formation

Formation is an immersive spiritual experience that will prepare you to encounter Jesus with the child.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is founded on the two pillars of scripture and liturgy; proclaiming God's word and celebrating His presence in the Eucharist.

Using the methods of Maria Montessori, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd fulfills the child's deepest need for relationship.

This formation will lay the groundwork for you to be able to foster the 3-6 year-old child's relationship with Jesus, prepare a proper atrium environment, compile a catechist's album, and create materials for the space.

A secondary goal of this experience is for the adult to fall more deeply in love with the Good Shepherd through contemplation, meditation, and work.
