
Palm Sunday

As we continue to move into the unknown with the COVID-19 pandemic, we encourage parishioners to enter into Holy Week as fully as possible, even though it will be very different than ever before. Even though we cannot gather as a community for prayer and worship, we hope to provide ideas on how to live this holiest of weeks at home. We encourage you to participate in the live streamed liturgies and then choose one of these resources based on the age of the members of your family to engage in this devotion. Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphal arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a donkey, and to the lavish praise of those around him who threw palms, or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a custom for people of great respect. Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace. The use of a donkey is highly symbolic, as it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace as opposed to on a steed in war.
