About Triduum

The Sacred Paschal Triduum includes Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil. The word Triduum comes from Latin for “the three days”. It refers to the liturgical season between Lent and the Easter Season. The liturgies of the Triduum are actually considered one liturgy spread over three days and is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. These days are the most sacred of the entire liturgical year of the Church where we honor Christ’s journey to the Cross and celebrate his resurrection.

“In the Sacred Triduum, the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried, and risen” – *Roman Missal*

Even though we cannot gather as a community for prayer and worship, we hope this worship aid to allow you to participate fully at home. We encourage you to pray, sing, and worship with us just as you would if you were at church. Physical items can help us connect our actions to the act of worship, so we encourage families to dress up and prepare a home altar. From our Domestic Churches we can unite as one community to praise God for the sacrifice and resurrection of his son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.



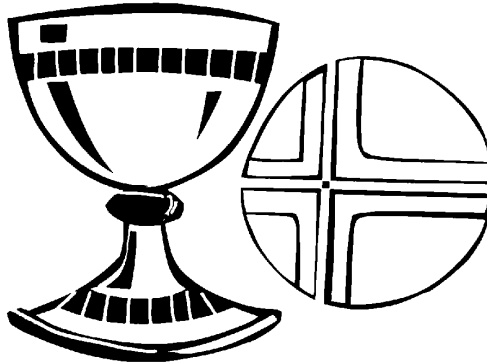

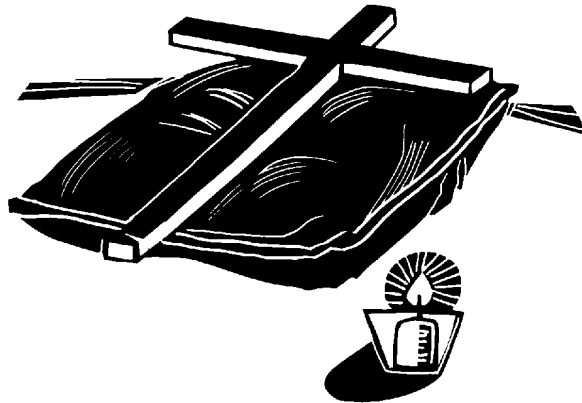
