St. Joseph

Pope Francis announced a special year dedicated to St. Joseph that started on December 8, 2020 and will go until December 8, 2021. During this year, the Apostolic Penitentiary issued a Decree granting special indulgences for the duration of this year to celebrate the anniversary and "to perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus." During this time, we will have the opportunity to commit ourselves "with prayer and good works, to obtain with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and tribulations that besiege the contemporary world today."
