About Triduum

The Sacred Paschal Triduum includes Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil. The word Triduum comes from Latin for “the three days”. It refers to the liturgical season between Lent and the Easter Season. The liturgies of the Triduum are actually considered one liturgy spread over three days and is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. These days are the most sacred of the entire liturgical year of the Church where we honor Christ’s journey to the Cross and celebrate his resurrection.

“In the Sacred Triduum, the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried, and risen” –

WASHING OF THE FEET

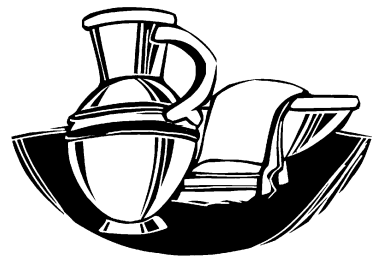

The washing of the feet paired with the Eucharist demonstrates that Christian love is both vertical (between us and God) and horizontal (between us and our neighbor).

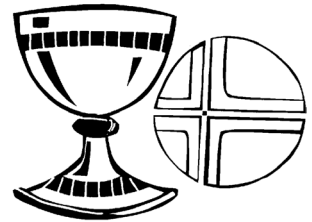



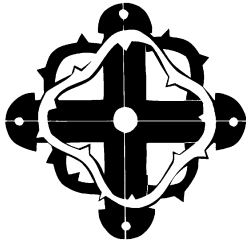
