Meet the Saints

One of the beautiful things about our faith is the saints. As Catholics we respect and honor the saints and consider them to be heroes of the Church. The saints are timeless examples of how to live a Christian life, providing endless hope. Not only were they sinners who kept trying to grow closer to God, but they also exemplify ways a person can serve God. The Church emphasizes that they were ordinary people from ordinary families and they were totally human. We will highlight a different saint each month of Together in Faith.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati was known for his joys, jokes, athleticism, care for the poor, selflessness, and for challenging his friends to virtue. He was born in 1901 to a wealthy family in Turin, Italy. He lived frugally and gave his money-and several times even the shoes or coat he was wearing- to the poor. Pier received his First Communion on June 19, 1911 at age 10. When he was just 12 years old, he began the practice of receiving the Eucharist daily. He referred to it as his "appointment with the Lord." He nurtured his devotion to the Eucharist by spending numerous hours in Adoration, even

at night. He encouraged others to receive the Eucharist as much as possible. He said "I urge you with all the strength of my soul to approach the Eucharistic Table as often as possible. Feed on this bread of Angels from which you will draw the strength to fight inner struggles, the struggles against passions and against all adversities, because Jesus Christ has promised to those who feed themselves with the most Holy Eucharist, eternal life and the necessary graces to obtain it." Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati died on July 4, 1925 at the age of 24 to polio. His love for the Eucharist is one of the many reasons that we decided to highlight him this month.
